

Create FHL Messages in your web browser



The WEB FHL service gives forwarders the ability to enter house level FHL data in to a web browser, save it for later amendment and send it to the Airline of their choice. When sending, the raw house level data is converted to an FHL EDI message and sent to the intended Airline using the CCS-UK message switch.

Easy to Use

The service is available to any forwarder anywhere in the world with access to a web browser.

Save Time

Users are able to retrieve Master AWB details from previously sent FHL messages, thereby saving time re keying when creating FHL messages.

Additionally users can set up a series of their own shipper and consignee details and use these details when creating FHL messages.

FHL data which users have created and stored is secure; access to the FHL data is restricted to the user who created it.

The FHL will be sent to the Airline associated with the Air Waybill Prefix. If the consignment will be carried by a different Airline, simply enter the carrier code of the appropriate Airline to change the routing.

Reduce Errors

To ensure a syntactically correct message is generated, automatic validation of the FHL data is performed before sending the FHL to the Airline.

Additionally, the Manifest description is validated against a list of descriptions known to be unacceptable for US Customs.

If a Harmonized Tariff code is entered, it is placed in the FHL message & prefixed by HTS/.

Using a web browser, users are able to view the History of FHL messages which have been sent. This will show if there was a problem sending a message, or if an error message was received from the Airline.
